## A History of Christmas presented by Barry Humphries

On December 7<sup>th</sup> we were treated to a highly entertaining talk by Barry Humphreys on the history of Christmas celebrations and how they have evolved over the centuries. Lots of illustrations were included to show how the original pagan winter rites morphed into much of the folklore which over time got passed into parts of our Christian celebrations; e.g. Christmas trees were part of the German culture and were brought to the U.K. by Prince Albert, Queen Victoria's husband. Father Christmas followed on from an earlier figure of an elderly bearded man who was part of European folklore centuries ago.

It was a lovely subject well suited to the Season and handled with humour and lots of research by Barry. As he has many more talks, (one of which he gave here before lockdown, on the Beatles) we hope to see him again before too long! Thank you to Barry and also to Pamela who organised it.

The day started off damp but dry and quite a large group of us were in cheery mood as we set off for the Parks via the Cathedral pathway,( which drops down at the side of the building and is lined by many gravestones built into the sandstone wall). It has grassed areas and in spring is full of snowdrops and crocus. Leaving the Cathedral we headed towards Toxteth, itself an interesting area with some beautiful old houses and connections with the Slave Trade. As we reached the first of the parks it started to rain lightly but even in the rain Princes Park is beautifully laid out with lakes and myriad trees and well worth a visit. Close by is Sefton Park probably best known for its huge glasshouse, the Palm House, now restored to its former glory after years of dereliction. It also boasts a boating lake, replica statues of Eros and Peter Pan and a cafe where we gratefully gathered as the rain became heavier!

We stayed in the cafe until the rain eased then proceeded to Otterspool Park which took us through to the Promenade. As we headed towards the Britannia Inn, where lunch awaited us, the view across the Mersey, as always, impresses!
