A VERY SPECIAL MEMBER

We are so very lucky in Oxton & Prenton U3A to have so many interesting and talented members, but it is not very often that one of our members has the honour of being invited to a reception at Buckingham Palace to meet H M Queen Elizabeth II, so I feel very privileged to include an article from that very special member, Kathleen Stansfield;

For the 50th Anniversary of The Winston Churchill Memorial Trust her Majesty the Queen and the Duke of Edinburgh are hosting a Reception at Buckingham Palace.......and you are invited!!

To receive such a message left me utterly dumbfounded and at first I thought it was some kind of joke. It was not a joke! The reason for my invitation was that I was a Churchill Fellow having successfully applied for a Travelling Fellowship in 1989.

This year being the 50th anniversary not only of the Trust but the 50th anniversary of Winston

Churchill's death a very special celebration had been planned. This was to invite just 300 of all the 5000 Churchill Fellows over the past 50 years to the Reception on March 18th at Buckingham Palace. We will never know who made the selections.

The experience was something never to be forgotten.



Passing through close security, I with others went through the magnificent gates of Buckingham Palace through the inner courtyard, into the Grand Hall and up the magnificent marble staircase although owing to my still healing broken hip I was gently led to a hidden lift and almost tenderly led into the Picture Gallery with the amazing collection of Old Masters where Pol Roger champagne was being served by lovely young women and the never ending supply of exquisite canapés.

Then at a given moment we were all 300 skilfully led through to the Music Room where the Queen, Prince Phillip, the Duke of Kent and the Duke of Gloucester stood in line to receive each of the 300.

The Queen looked as always, serene and smiling and her white glove gently touched the tips of my fingers. There was a lovely twinkle in her eye; I suppose she might have noticed that I had a hospital walking stick. Or who knows maybe she remembered that in 1990 on the 25th Anniversary of Churchill's death she had presented me with my silver medal at The Guildhall in London. I was so overwhelmed by this second meeting that I walked straight past the three Royal dukes smiling blissfully. I do not suppose they thought anything of it.

Afterward the Royal dukes circulated among us all talking to everyone, including me. I found the Duke of Gloucester very jolly and full of interest in everything. Royal Household personnel were at the side of each Royal gently moving them on to other groups.

The ladies will want to know "WHAT DID YOU WEAR?" Our instructions were Day Dress but whatever you feel comfortable in hats and gloves were not necessary.

I wore black evening trousers slim fit and a simple multicoloured ¾ sleeve top which skimmed my still swollen hip and had a diamante buckle at the V neck. Happily I was able to wear pretty wedge shoes.

Yes, another very special day to remember.


